

## Board of Directors

Indian Wells Valley Water District is governed by a five-member Board of Directors elected by voters within the Indian Wells Valley Water District. Directors are elected to a four-year staggered terms, with elections held in even-numbered years.

**Harold W. Manning – Director** – A Ridgecrest resident since 1982, Harold Manning was first elected to the Board of Directors in 2002. Mr. Manning has been a Certified Public Accountant since 1974. He is a member of the American Institute of CPAs; the California Society of CPAs; and the Washington Society of CPAs. His accounting practice clientele includes several other water districts and community service districts (whose primary concern is providing water), giving him an in-depth familiarity with the challenges being faced by water utilities across the region, both fiscally and otherwise. When Harold gets the chance, he teaches ballroom dancing with his wife, Rancy. Off the dance floor, the two enjoy art, traveling and eating at “great” restaurants.



**Donald J. Cortichiato – President** – Mr. Cortichiato graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Economics from the University of California, Riverside. He retired from federal civil service in 2004 after 33 years at the Naval Weapons Center, China Lake. He had a variety of specialist, supervisory and managerial experience in both the Human Resources Department and the Safety and Security Department. After retiring, Mr. Cortichiato volunteered with the local NARFE (National Active and Retired Federal Employees) chapter, raised funds for the Ridgecrest Habitat for Humanity, volunteered with the local American Cancer Society Relay for Life, and was employed for 3 years with State Farm as a licensed insurance and financial services representative. He is a member of the Supervisory Committee of AltaOne Federal Credit Union. Mr. Cortichiato was elected to the Board of Directors in 2004. Since that time, he has worked with the IWV Cooperative Water Management Group and has served on all sub-committees of the Water District: Administrative/Executive, Finance, Water Management, Plant & Equipment, and Alternate Water Supply. Mr. Cortichiato has represented the Water District in the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) both as an elected Board Member of Region 7 and as a member of the ACWA statewide Insurance and Personnel Committee. Mr. Cortichiato is married to Erma and they have five daughters. He is an avid bicyclist and recently enjoyed the 450 mile RAGBRAI across the state of Iowa.



**Leroy H. Corlett – Vice-President** – Having resided locally for 56 years, Leroy Corlett and wife Carol originally relocated to the high desert from Long Beach on the advice of a pediatrician in an effort to ease their son's asthma. In 1957, this two-time past Water Board president completed his Associate of Arts degree at Bakersfield City College as part of the Naval Ordnance Test Station (NOTS) China Lake's apprentice program. During his career on Base, he worked primarily as a project engineer. His last position there was Avionics Lead Engineer in the Advanced Projects Office. On this assignment, he was responsible for supporting the development, integration, and testing of complex avionics systems and assuring that Navy requirements were met. In 1995, Corlett went to work for Lockheed Martin Corporation as a senior engineer. Corlett believes his time with the Navy's Research & Development team and his resultant accumulation of technical and management knowledge are two valuable assets he brings to IWVWD policy making decisions. “Solutions that are timely and cost effective are key,” Corlett explained. “I advocate fiscal accountability. I also



want to see the District become more pro-active in the areas of system operation, water conservation, understanding of our aquifer and alternate water supply sources.” Although he is now in retirement after his years with the Navy and Lockheed Martin, Corlett sounds surprised to find himself busier than ever. “I am the District’s representative on the Navy’s environmental Restoration Advisory Board, the Mojave Desert-Mountain Resource Conservation Council” and the Inyo-Mono Integrated Regional Water Management Program, he said and added with a laugh, “I used to enjoy working on automobiles but they are so complex that there is no time for that now.”

The Corletts are parents of five adult children: Rick, Gary, David, Lorie and Kevin.
